## Healthy Moment

### Arthritis and Aging: What's the Connection?

*"The night racks my bones, and the pain that gnaws me takes no rest." Job 30:17*

As we age, we tend to become more aware of common diseases associated with aging. One chronic disease that affects many older adults is arthritis, which causes joint pain, stiffness and swelling. Arthritis is one of the body's natural reactions to disease or injury and is very common, especially as we get older. The good news is that it can be managed. "If you suspect you may have arthritis, your primary care physician can do an exam and order tests and based on the findings can determine if you have the condition and refer you to a specialist if necessary," says Yawen Cheng, MD, an internal medicine physician at Scripps Coastal Medical Center Encinitas.

More than 50 million adults in the United States have been diagnosed with arthritis, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). By 2040, the number is expected to grow to nearly 80 million. Almost half of adults 65 and older have some form of arthritis, according to the CDC. Arthritis and other rheumatic conditions are also a leading cause of work disability among U.S. adults. Arthritis is more common in people with other chronic conditions, such as obesity, diabetes and heart disease.

Arthritis is not a single disease. There are more than 100 different types of arthritis and related conditions. Osteoarthritis is the most common type of arthritis and the risk of developing it increases with age. Osteoarthritis is a degenerative joint disease marked by the breakdown of the joint's cartilage. It occurs most frequently in the hands, hips and knees. Rheumatoid arthritis, gout and fibromyalgia are other common forms of arthritis.

Rheumatoid arthritis is an autoimmune disease, where the immune system attacks healthy cells in the body by mistake, causing inflammation in the affected parts of the body. Most types of arthritis are more common in women. Gout is more common in men.

Arthritis diagnosis often begins with a primary care physician performing a physical exam, and when necessary, running blood tests and imaging scans to get to the source of the problem. Each type of arthritis can have different symptoms. Some do not have any symptoms outside the joint. Other forms cause fatigue, fever and a rash. Most types of arthritis show signs of joint inflammation, including swelling and stiffness.

People can take steps to reduce their risk of developing the disease, including:

**1. Maintain a healthy weight**

Losing excess weight is a lifestyle adjustment that can alleviate pain and slow progression of arthritis. Extra weight can put more stress on weight-bearing joints like the hips and knees.

**2. Eat a well-balanced, nutritious diet**

A healthy eating plan emphasizes fruits, vegetables, whole grains and fat-free or low fat milk and milk products. Vitamin D rich foods include seafood, such as cod and wild-caught salmon, fortified milk and eggs. Yogurt, sardines, beans and almonds are high in calcium and other nutrients.

**3. Stay active, keep fit**

Arthritis is more prevalent among adults who are not physically active. Exercise helps develop strong muscles, which can protect and support joints. Adults should aim for 150 minutes weekly of moderate-intensity exercises, like brisk walking, or 75 minutes of vigorous aerobic activities, such as cycling over 10 mph. Adults should aim for at least two days of muscle-strengthening activities and balance-enhancing exercises, like one-foot standing. If you cannot do 150 minutes a week, be as active as your health permits.

#### **4. Prevent injury**

When you injure your joints while playing sports or in an accident, you can damage cartilage and cause it to wear out more quickly. Knee arthritis in young people is often the result of a previous injury. Avoid injury by using the proper safety equipment when playing sports and learn correct exercise techniques.

If you think you are at risk for arthritis, consult your primary care physician, your first line of protection against illness. Arthritis typically advances gradually but your physician can recommend lifestyle changes that can slow the progress of arthritis. If needed, your physician can refer you to a rheumatologist.

On May 6, 2026, a fire erupted at Trinity United Church of Christ in Dorseyville, Pennsylvania. Rev. 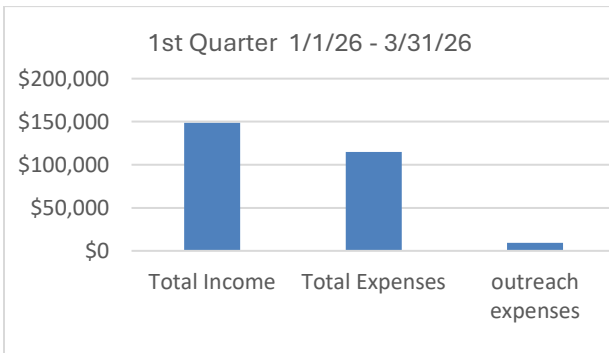
### FINANCIAL UPDATE FOR THE 1<sup>ST</sup> QUARTER OF 2026

Two missed Sundays for snowstorms and increased expenses for snow removal can cause havoc with a church budget. Despite

those factors and due to the generous gifts of so many, the first quarter ended positively with a total income of \$154,790 as compared to expenses of \$124,256. Our donations to UCC outreach and other outreach organizations were \$9,231 for the quarter.

Looking ahead, the second quarter will bring staffing changes as we welcome an Interim Sr. Pastor and it's also the start of summer vacation season. Our consistent giving will be more important than ever. **Have you ever considered electronic giving for your weekly offering?** This method of giving helps tremendously, especially when members are away as their offerings will still be here. Electronic giving also helps the church to know a portion of our income that is available for any given month.

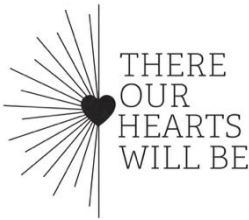

### **PARKING LOT LIGHTS FUNDRAISER**

The lighting of the parking lot is not very good at night and it is difficult to see when attending church activities in the evening. The Ministry of Trustees obtained a quote from Bergey's Electric to improve the lighting. The Council approved the project and Bergey's is ordering the parts. The project includes installing LED lighting (which will save money for the church), painting the light poles to decrease rusting, and trimming trees that may interfere with lighting. The total amount is \$9,200. A donation of \$5,935 has been received from a bequest for Bill Wack that was intended to be used for a trustee/maintenance project. The Trustees are having a fundraiser to collect the remaining amount needed to pay for the lighting (\$3,265). Each Sunday for the month of June, there will be a bucket in the atrium to collect your loose change and any amount you wish to contribute towards this project. Thank you for helping to improve the safety in our parking lot.
